WHAT ARE THE WIA **SCORECARD** AND THE BUSINESS SERVICES **SCORECARD**?

South Central Michigan Works! (SCMW!) is part of the workforce investment system that is funded by the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) which authorizes more than 550 local business-led workforce investment boards (WIBs) that cover all fifty states, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Territories to oversee workforce development services through a network of 3,000 One-Stop Career Centers. Through WIA, local civic, business and workforce development leaders develop strategies that leverage funding and resources within their local communities to prepare and match the skills of workers with the workforce demands of companies. The WIA Scorecard examines the benefits and costs SCMW!'s WIA funded programs and the regional economic impacts of SCMW! in its service area which includes Hillsdale, Jackson, and Lenawee Counties in Michigan. The Business Services Scorecard measures the regional economic impacts of the services provided SCMW! to employers.

HOW WERE THE SCORECARDS **CONDUCTED**?

The WIA Scorecard applied data from SCMW! on the number of participants in the WIA adult, dislocated worker, and youth programs who entered employment during the program year, along with their associated pre-program and post-program earnings, to assess the benefits and costs generated by the programs over the next ten-year period. The WIA Scorecard also requested employee and finance data from SCMW! to measure how the expenditures of the WIB and its employees affect regional jobs and income. For the Business Services Scorecard, data supplied by SCMW! on the number of jobs created or saved in the region due to the WIB's services to employers formed the basis for determining the extent to which these jobs contributed to regional economic growth in the program year.

RESULTS

<p>Benefit-cost analysis of WIA programs</p>	<p>The adult, dislocated worker, and youth programs at SCMW! served 2,932 people in PY 2009. Of these, 123 adults, 126 dislocated workers, and 36 youth entered employment during the same year.</p> <p>Adult program participants who entered employment in PY 2009 are projected to generate a present value of \$6.9 million in additional income over the next ten-year period. The corresponding income effect of the dislocated worker program is \$2 million, and the income effect of the youth program is \$1.5 million.</p> <p>By the end of the ten-year time horizon, the adult program at SCMW! is projected to yield a cumulative added value of \$2.26 in income per dollar spent to fund the program. Similarly, the dislocated worker program will yield \$0.57 for every dollar spent, and the youth program will generate \$0.80.</p> <p>Overall, the combined adult, dislocated worker, and youth programs at SCMW! will generate a cumulative added value of \$1.22 for every dollar spent.</p>	<p>2,932 participants served 285 people who enter employment</p> <p>Benefits over ten-year period:</p> <p>\$6.9M – adults \$2M – dislocated worker \$1.5M – youth</p> <p>Cumulative added value of \$1.22 for every WIA dollar spent</p>
